Basil Rajapaksa, Minister of Economic Development on 25th September 2012.

The Opening of Black Gram Purchasing, Storing, Process-

ing and Marketing Centre in Anuradhapura was opened by Hon. Basil Rajapaksa, Minister of Economic Development on 28.08.2012. This centre facilitates the Agriculture Community in LKR 5.0 Mn for this sub project.

Dairy Development in Rural Areas.

Dairy production is one of the main sectors which have an untapped market demand. Based on the government's priority and improving economic conditions in the local dairy markets, future prospects for the dairy industry are strong and positive. By developing the dairy sector in rural areas, it is envisage to increase income of the people as well as nutritional levels of the community. At present the local milk production of the country is meet only 33% of the national requirement.

Interconnectivity Village Development

Adavikanda Road in Kuruwita D.S Division in Ratnapura (5.4 Km in length) has been Constructed at the cost of LKR 42.2 Mn under Interconnectivity Village Development Program 2,195 families in the district will be benefited.



The Ministry of Economic Development implemented a sub project to develop 110 household/dairy units in Badulla, Moneragala, Polonnaruwa, Kegalle, Nuwara Eliya, Hambantota, Kurunegala, Ratnapura and Kalutara Districts. Providing new cattle to the producers; facilitation to improve the conditions of cattle sheds and cultivation of fodder lands were carried out to develop the dairy industry in rural areas, in collaboration with the Department of Animal Production and Health. It has contributed LKR 39.5Mn

Drinking Water to Janathapura Village in Badulla

A Drinking Water Scheme was opened for 200 families in Janathapura Village at the Cost of LKR 0.9 Mn.

Renovation of Kalmadhu Tank in Kilinochchi

The Kalmadhu Tank was damaged during the conflict period and the Ministry of Economic Development implemented a sub project to renovate the tank for paddy cultivation and support the resettled farming families. The Kalmadhu tank at Kilinochchi was ceremonially opened by Hon. Basil Rajapaksa, Minister of Economic Development on 11.03.2012. Total project cost was LKR 128.0 Mn. This tank provides irrigation facility for 1,396.17 Ha of paddy land and benefit 1,500 farming families.

Livelihood Development for Resettled IDPs in the Northern Province

For the purpose of the restoration of livelihoods of resettled internally displaced people in the Northern Province, a project is being implemented by the Ministry with grant funds from the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction through the Asian Development Bank. engaged in the improvement of 200 km of field canals, 100 km rural roads and Agro Wells through the cash for work program.

National Mine Action Programme in Sri Lanka

Following the end of the conflict, one of the main challenges faced by the gov-

ernment was to resettle nearly 300,000 Internally Displaced People (IDP) in their own habitats. Contamination of most of their lands with mines and Explosive Remnants of War (ERW) were the among threats to the return people. The Government committed it self fully to the Mine Action Programme by expanding treasury funds from 2009 to 2012. The Mine Action Programme cost LKR 10,507.8 Mn. As at September 2012 the total area demined is 1,953 Km2 and 900,512 devices have been recovered (Anti Personal, Anti-Tank and UXO).



National Mine Action Programme in Sri Lanka — Awareness Creation

The Mine Risk Education Progarmme provides support for mine-safe behavior among communities. It aims to minimize deaths and injuries from landmines and explosive remnants of war and to reduce the social and economic impacts. During the first nine months of this year 342 MRE programmes were conducted along with 46,000 participants innewly resettled areas.

Opening of Divi Neguma Training Centre in Vavuniya



This training Centre provides Training facilities to the agricultural community in Vavuniya and the adjoining districts.

Drinking Water to three villages in Polonaruwa District

Anurapura, Divuldamana and Ihalawewa GN Divisions in Dimbulagala were severely affected by conflict. When these villages were selected for development, one of the major demands from villagers was obtain drinking water facilities. Therefore, the Ministry implemented a sub project at the cost of LKR 14.0 Mn out of which LKR 10.0 Mn came from the Ministry and the balance from community contribution. This Water Supply Project was opened on 24.08.2012 by Hon. Basil Rajapaksa, Minister

of Economic Development 630 families were benefited by this programme.



Manuals for Tourism Development

The US AID helped launch two manuals 'Tourism Roadside Signage Guidelines' and 'Start Your Tourism Business' boosting Sri Lanka's rapidly growing tourism industry.

Rehabilitation of Kaluwawala Tank in Anuradhapura District



Under the patronage of Hon. Basil-Rajapaksa, Minister of Economic Development, the programme to rehabilitate 2000 village tanks is progressing well. The program covers 16 districts including Northern, Eastern, Central and North Central Provinces.

The Kaluwawala tank in the Parangiyawadiya at Horowpthana DS has been reconstructed under this program. After completion, the extent of crop land that can be effectively cultivated will increase from 70 to 200 hectares. A total of LKR 21.0 Mn has been allocated for this rehabilitation work.



Southern Development Authority of Sri Lanka

Helping Hand to "Divi Neguma" Integrating with the National Divi Neguma program of the Government, Southern Development Authority has taken measures to uplift living standards of 15,000 families living in 150 villages in the Galle, Matara, Hambantota, and Monaragala Districts under the sectors of agriculture, livestock, fisheries and domestic Industries.

Several programs have been launched to provide seeds, planting materials for farms and chicks , calves etc for those who are engaged in poultry, cattle and goat farming.


Udarata Development Authority of Sri Lanka

Department of National Botanic Gardens

1) Development

The first botanic garden developed by local experts after 130 years (the 3rd botanic garden was established in 1876 by British) is being established at Mirijjawila, Hambantota with the objective of ex-situ conservation of dry and arid zone plants contributing to the economic development of the country by developing floriculture/ herbal industry and ecotourism in the area. Development activities of the Garden are accelerated. A substantial proportion (approximately 50%) of development activi-

2) Floriculture

 Floriculture research and development activities were continued at the Floriculture Development Unit of the Peradeniya garden.

 Equipped farmers in Floriculture by distributing 50,000 m² UV treated polythene un-

ties of the garden has been completed and approximately 40% of the planting activities and the construction of internal roads have also been completed. Establishment of the entrance complex and the car park, summer houses with toilets, staff quarters, floriculture extension office and shade net houses are the major constructions on going.

Approximately 50% of development activities of the new Wet Zone Botanic garden at Avissawella has been completed. The establishment of an entrance complex



New Matching Grant Scheme to stimulate LKR 4.00 bn investment in Tourism sector

Sustainable Tourism Development Project (STDP) is implemented by the Government of Sri Lanka (GOSL) with the financial assistance from the World Bank. After restructuring this project in 2012, approximately US \$ 16.0 Mn is allocated for provision of Matching Grants to tourism related SMEs projects engaged in the tourism sector with a view to improve and extend the product content and supply chain of the (SMEs) related to the tourism industry. It is expected that the project will bring new investment of LKR 4.00

bn to the tourism industry which will improve the sustainability of Sri Lanka Tourism by improving the quality of products and services and creating new jobs.

Further the Matching Grant Scheme (MGS) is to upgrade product standards and improve managerial and technical skills of SME projects in the tourism sector. Funds available under the MGS will be provided to the eligible end users as an outright grant through a Matching Grant Administrator Bank. This Grant will cover 50% of the eligible expenditure of the proposed sub-project up to a maximum of LKR 10.0 Mn.

Tourism Resources Improvement Project (TRIP)

Ministry of Economic Development with the loan facilities of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) has lunched the Tourism Resources Improvement Project (TRIP) in 2007.


The overall objective of the project is to increase income levels of people and alleviate poverty through earning foreign exchange and creating income generating opportunities in the tourism sector by attracting foreign tourists especially Japanese.

The project has four main components.

- 1. Infrastructure Development in four major tourist destinations of Negombo, Sigiriya, Anuradhapura and Nuwara Eliya.
- 2. Tourism Marketing and Promotion Programme targeting Japanese Market.
- 3. Human Resource Development Programme to upgrade the Capacity of Sri Lanka in Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management (SLITHM).
- 4. Community Development Programme.
